December Rent

Director Kevin Frazier-Jones has announced Sock & Buskin will be holding auditions on **Saturday, October 8 at 2 pm** for our December production of *Rent*. Everyone, age 16 and older, is invited to audition with a prepared song. No more than 30 actors will be cast in the show.

Rent, by Jonathan Larson, is set in the East Village of New York City, based loosely on Puccini's *La Boheme*; and follows a year in the life of a group of friends struggling to make it in the big city; falling in love, finding a voice, and living for today!

This show won the Pulitzer Prize for Drama in 1996 and also received Tonys for Best Musical, Best Score, Best Book, and Best Featured Actor in a Musical.

Rent is currently the 9th longest running musical in Broadway history, running 12 years on Broadway, closing in 2008 after 5,123 performances.

Due to the adult nature of this show (language and situations), students age 16 and 17 must have an adult bring them to the auditions and sign a consent form.

Kevin notes that rehearsals will be held mostly on weekends until tech

week. The show will be performed December 9-10-11 at The Historic Sidney Theatre.

From Kent's kitchen...

Cranberry Apple Crisp

1 16-oz can whole cranberry sauce	2 cups chopped apples
1 t cinnamon	1 cup uncooked rolled oats
½ cup brown sugar	1/3 cup flour
½ t. salt	½ cup chopped nuts
¼ cup shortening, melted	

Combine cranberry sauce, apples, and cinnamon and place in an 8 or 9-inch square pan.

Combine rolled oats, brown sugar, flour, salt, and nuts. Add melted shortening and mix until crumbly. Sprinkle over cranberry mix.

Bake at 350° for 45 minutes.

Serve warm with Cool Whip or ice cream.
